In the aviation industry, pilots rely on a variety of instruments and gauges to keep them informed about the functioning of the various important subsystems that are all required to keep an aircraft safely in the air and on the proper course. As aircraft grew larger and more complex, their manufacturers faced two challenges. The first was just fitting all of the gauges into the limited space. The second was keeping the layout intuitive enough that pilots could quickly find the information that they needed. The solution came with the advent of LCD panels. Now, through a variety of video displays, pilots can access the information that they require with the level of detail appropriate to the situation. These arrangements of displays came to be known as a "glass cockpit." The earliest version of this church assessment – more than a decade ago – utilized the structure and metaphor of a "glass cockpit." After ten years of user feedback, we have retained many of those elements, but opted for a general theme aligned to the Biblical imperative of fruitbearing.

Churches are much more complicated than airplanes. They represent the collective insights, biases, experience, wisdom, hopes, and fears of each of their members. They tend to rely on a limited staff and lots of volunteers. They are entrusted with a mission more critical than any aircraft has ever flown: the Great Commission. So, in order to help church leaders make wise decisions, ChurchTech has designed the Fruitbearing Congregation Health Assessmentto provide critical information about your congregation.







Who took the survey for our church?







Glass Cockpit Overview of Variables





Usefulness and limitations of the Glass Cockpit

The Glass Cockpit is an assessment tool. It is not an end in itself, but rather it is the starting point for more questions. As you review the pages of information that follow, ask yourself:



You now possess a very useful collection of information about your church. But, alone, it can not tell the whole story or describe the best course for the future. It may be a sufficient springboard to aid you in planning for the future. However, many congregations may still be best served to hire a consultant. A good consultant who specializes in church health and growth will bring objectivity and knowledge of the field in a way that most churches simply can not replicate internally. ChurchTech certainly has consultants that can help, but other resources to consider are denominational offices, Church Doctor Ministries, or the various members of the American Society for Church Growth.






Leadership Unpacked

The church is the Body of Christ. The church is also an organization. Organizations are strongly influenced by the character and quality of their leaders. [Consider Deuteronomy 1:13] Think about the critical roles that leaders have played in the Old and New Testaments. In the best of times, quality leadership is important. In challenging times, leadership is even more important.

There are many resources available to help boost the character and quality of leadership in a church. Often, the issue is not the presence or absence of leaders, but rather the willingness of some to lead and others to follow. Consider the following:

- > Do we burn-out our leaders or is their time of service an opportunity to grow spiritually?
- > Do we utilize people according to their spiritual gifts or do we use them to fill blank spots on an organizational chart?
- > Do we honor, respect, and pray for our leaders?
- > Do we have high expectations for our leaders?
- > Do we expect leaders to lead or to follow the perceived preferences of the crowd?





Gift Leverage Unpacked

Churches vary in how they reconcile the different lists of spiritual gifts found in the New Testament. They also differ over cessationism (the view that certain charismatic gifts like prophecy or speaking in tongues have ceased to be gifted by the Holy Spirit). Those distinctions are not trivial. Nonetheless, wide experience indicates that whichever list of Spiritual Gifts is employed, it is essential that it actually be employed. Too many churches reserve Spiritual Gifting as strictly a sermon topic and not as an essential guide to staffing (whether paid or volunteer) in order to carry out the work of the local church.


Governance Unpacked

At some congregational meetings, copies of the constitution and Roberts Rules of Order are in more plentiful supply than Bibles. In other congregations, the constitution and bylaws are so seldom referred to that there are serious legal compliance issues.

Some churches have church councils or vestries or sessions; some have elders and deacons; some have a board of directors. Some have a mix of them all. There is not a singular perfect system for governing all congregations. Even when the "perfect" structure is in place, growing to a new size may require a new structure. Denominational rules or traditions may also limit the range of options.

Yet, with so many differences, we can apply some "yardsticks" to any structure:

- > Does the system work? (Does it support rather than impede ministry?)
- > Do people understand it?
- > Do people trust it?
- > Does it unduly burden those who lead?


Worship Unpacked

Few elements of church life (if any) rival worship for the blunt subjectiveness of the opinions called forth. At one church, a 15 minute sermon is too long. Across the street, a 40 minute sermon might be called too short. Music tempo, volume, and instrumentation cover all the extremes. Liturgical rules and the lectionary calendar define some churches, yet are completely foreign in others.

Your church has a "way" of worshipping. You might have more than one way if you use different service types each week to reach different groups of people. Don't over-analyze the individual worship components reflected in this chart. The preaching scores, especially, tend to be heavily shaded by overall satisfaction with the person preaching rather than with just what is preached. Focus on the collective worship experience.

Yet, with so many differences, we can apply some "yardsticks" to any structure:

- > Are the people at your church having an experience that they perceive as a genuine encounter with God?
- > In what ways can we enhance that experience?
- > Can we make that experience more accessible to visitors?



Small Groups Unpacked

There were times that Jesus taught crowds of thousands. There were other times that he shared an important experience with just a few. As humans, we each have differing needs for interaction in large anonymous groups, mid-size groups where we are partly known, and smaller groups where we are very well known. The size of our families and workplaces, among other influences, shape each of us in the crowd sizes that we seek out. Churches need to help people connect at each of those different levels.

Small groups, implemented well, can have a transformative effect on individuals and on a whole congregation. Affinity groups are particularly effective, but other models work as well. Curriculum, or at least topics, can be defined for everyone or selected by each particular group. So:

- > If you have small groups, how can you strengthen them and encourage more people to participate?
- > If not, why not?






In Matthew 22:37, Jesus reminds us of the imperative to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." If there was a single word to describe how we perceived and responded to the world around us it might be: "attitude." Worldview is our attitude about the world. Worldview is more than a philosophical perspective – it is the rudder that steers us through life. Churches are stronger and healthier when they are filled with lots of people whose rudders are pointed in a common, god-honoring direction. They grow when they can passionately communicate that perspective with others.



Evangelism Unpacked

For generations, many congregations grew through a powerful numeric tool – household size. A century ago, the average U.S. family had more than two children. Today, after a century of fairly steady decline, the average family has less than two children. More than two children per couple means a net gain in each generation, while less than two means a net decline. Combine that trend with changing realities about institutional loyalty and you find a landscape filled with slowly shrinking churches.

Yet, we are also in an unprecedented era of mega-church growth. What accounts for the growth? Motivation is a big factor – churches that are passionate about sharing the good news for the sake of the recipient tend to be much more effective than those driven by a perceived need for more members. Programs are also significant, especially if the programs respond to a particular need that is felt in the community. All eleven factors in this report matter, but ultimately, inviting habits are key. Churches whose members talk (positively) about their church, invite people to it, and bring people to it generally grow.






Vision Unpacked

Have you ever left on vacation with no idea where you where going? Few of us are that spontaneous. We may not know all of the details, but we want to have at least a general idea where our journey will lead us. Church participation is much the same. People need to know what future the leaders of the church are working toward for two reasons: trust & mobilization. If people don't trust the direction that a church is headed, then they will be reluctant to continue on the journey. If people aren't passionately sold on the vision for the future, then it is hard to mobilize them to work toward that goal. The future is, to some degree, abstract. A key element of defining vision is pointing to those current realities that are bedrock principles and will not change. With that foundation, the elements of change can then be communicated.

- > Is that vision widely known and supported?
- > Is that vision restated and reinforced often?
- > Can you discern progress toward those future goals?




Technology Unpacked

Effective ministries have always utilized the best resources available to them.


In 1986, Alban Institute published Martin F. Saarinen's: The Life Cycle of a Congregation. In the decade that followed it became a source of much inspiration and consternation. In later years, it was the subject of much reappropriation by critics, consultants, and judicatories. The simple premise is that a TYPICAL congregation (like many other organization types) is likely to follow a particular pattern of early growth, maturity, plateau, decline, and closure. A Bell curve is typically used to represent this pattern. The Lifecycle concept remains a powerful model for church self-awareness, particularly in asking questions like:

- > What is our history? How did we arrive at our present reality?
- > Barring significant changes (good and bad, planned and not) where are we headed?

It is not a mechanized version of Biblical prophecy. It is not best employed merely to pronounce doom and hopelessness. And, again, it is based upon a TYPICAL congregation. Congregations, like people, tend to be unique!




In 1996, ChurchTech's Brad Miller was working on his doctorate, doing some pulpit supply, and earning a paycheck doing some transportation planning for a regional government office. He noticed something curious: the graphed curves in Saarinen's Life Cycle matched up with a new project from the US Department of Transportation (DOT) called: Pavement Management. Pavement Management (now widespread) is based on the premise that a typical section of road has a lifecycle and that major repairs where more or less cost-effective at different spots along that lifecycle curve. Major reconstruction was a poorer investment if done either too soon (not yet necessary) or too late (major damage to the substructure). So, State and Federal DOT's developed sophisticated computer algorithms to measure conditions and extrapolate repair timetables. Hence an ideal Pavement management cycle might look something like this and extend well into the future:



The same concept can work for congregations! Timely intervention by a trained and objective outsider at regular intervals can help congregations identify the causes driving decline and create plans for solutions that strengthen the church.

The size of a church influences the ways in which people interact with members, visitors, and staff. Hence, the roles of the Pastor and other staff can vary greatly, as can the styles of conflict, the methods of governance, and the array of available resources.

Because congregations change in size over time, it is not at all uncommon for a congregation to retain attributes of the previous size while they are endeavoring to function in their present size. Size can, with both risks and benefits, be aspirational: you may staff and structure around the size that you think you are headed towards rather than the one you presently occupy. Additional nuances include a pastor serving more than one congregation or multiple worship services that have distinctly unique sub-populations


Tradition and facilities are key complications in the adjustment between levels. "If it was good enough for our parents and grandparents" may be a potent argument to overcome in leading a congregation to adapt to the present size and circumstances. Likewise, a building that is substantially larger than the present needs can become the "tail wagging the dog" – especially if deferred maintenance and energy inefficiency are compounding challenges. There is no singular agreed upon breakdown in the following categories. If your congregation has changed significantly in size over the past generation, it is likely worthy of your time to read further on the subject. 
Conflict

The mere presence of conflict within a congregation is not necessarily a cause for immediate concern. Constructive conflict can lead a congregation to constructive discussion and planning for the future. A congregation devoid of conflict might be a congregation living in denial of the challenges surrounding it. But, there are certainly more constructive and less constructive ways for conflict to be expressed and dealt with. This survey uses language that yields clues about conflict that may be divisive or build unhealthy tension.

For much of the 20th Century, the primary means of growing churches was the absence of birth control. Parents had kids. Kids grew up and stayed in the community. They got married and had more kids. Churches grew. Recent decades have seen substantial shifts toward mobility. It is no longer an assumption either that offspring will raise a family near their nest of origin or that they will remain active in their home church or denomination. Churches are, hence, become less family-rooted. Family can be both a blessing and a burden in a congregation, so there is merit in looking at that mix.

Bible Reading Habits

Literature in the overlapping fields of spiritual health, parish education, and Great Commission research, point to considerable benefits of frequent reading of Holy Scripture in personal or household devotional practice. The intellectual versus spiritual versus motivational nature of these benefits are fodder for great debates. What is little doubted is that believers more engaged in Bible reading tend also to be more engaged in the life of their congregations. Not surprisingly, Imams and priests in Muslim, Hindu, and Buddhist traditions have come to conclude similarly that there is great value in private reading or recitation of whatever scriptures a particular faith deems to be holy. There is no silver bullet for resolving low engagement, but awareness of your present context is an essential starting point. We break this down across numerous demographics to aid your discernment about wahat strengths to build upon and what gaps to redress.

To a hammer, everything looks like a nail.

How we, individually and collectively, understand the purpose of the church has enormous influence on what happens in congregations. Our sense of purpose shapes our priorities our goals and the urgency that we attach to seeing those goals attained. Many, many congregations have a sizable gap between the purpose on paper in their governing documents and the purpose in the mindset populating the pews. Further, there can be gaps be staff and members, volunteers and staff, or multiple clergy on a single staff. For many church consultants, this is the "gold standard" question. It gives a set of powerful insights collectively and in the discrepancies. But, be forewarned, a not insignificant number of respondents – without a dishonest intention – will answer what they think the correct answer should be, rather than what they really feel it is. (Consultants get at this think/feel disconnect by looking at the witness and multiplication practices.)

Many variables contribute to growth and evangelism at a congregation. Everything from the quality of preaching to the quality of coffee to the sanctuary temperature to the Social Media strategy, all have an impact. Yet, 3 variables in particular are more telling than all of the others combined: because these 3 have the greatest impact on the likelihood of a first time visit by others:

- > The percentage of members who tell others
- > The percentage of members who invite others; and
- > The percentage of members who bring others.

Everything matters when it comes to evangelism, but these three matter more than all of the rest. Again, there is no silver bullet solution for correcting a deficiency here, but the following pages yield insights about what demographics are leading and lagging in this regard.
